- 4 in confidence I can assure *you* with the *world* it would obtain *little credit* that my movements
- 5 to the chair of Government will be accompanied with feelings not unlike those of a culprit who
- 6 is going to the place of his execution: so unwilling am I, in the evening of a life nearly
- 7 consumed in public cares, to quit a peaceful abode for an Ocean of difficulties, without that
- 8 competency of political skill- abilities & inclination which is necessary to manage the helm. I
- 9 am sensible, that I am embarking the voice of my Countrymen and a good name of my own, on
- this voyage, but what returns will be made for them- Heaven alone can foretell. Integrity &
- firmness is all I can promise- these, be the voyage long or short... With best wishes for Mrs.
- 12 Knox, & sincere friendship for yourself- I remain Your affectionate
