

Colonial Days- Arrival Checklist- Oct. 29 & 30

To Dos:



1) Arrival:

- Arrive at the main circle for passenger unloading.
- Assemble students in front of the main gate, in their pre-assigned groups.



2) Go to Ticketing:

- Send the trip leader to the ticketing window to collect materials.
- Distribute tickets, maps, and identification stickers to chaperones.



3) Drop off Lunches:

- If you brought lunch, ask a staff member for access to the storage area near the main gate.
- If you did not bring lunch, see map on next page for additional information on where to purchase food or pick-up pre-orders.



4) Enter Security & Bag Check:

- Check-in at the Orientation Table
- All visitors will enter through a scanner.
- All bags will be inspected.



5) Enjoy Indoor Activities:

- Reorganize groups if needed.
- Use restrooms if needed.
- Check time for Mansion Tour.
- Communicate last-minute announcements to students and chaperones.
- Visit indoor activity stations in the lower-level lobby.



6) Enjoy Outdoor Activities:

- Follow the map on the next page to the North Lane.
- Allow 5 minutes to get from the Orientation Center to North Lane.
- Proceed to Mansion Line at tour time.

Guest Code of Conduct:

Please review the following with your students and chaperones before arrival:

- Rude or inappropriate treatment and unwelcome behavior (verbal, physical, or visual) are not permitted.
- Disorderly conduct or unauthorized assemblies are not permitted.
- Damaging, removing, or tampering with structures is not permitted.
- Personal photography is allowed estate-wide (without flash) without camera accessories.
- Video and audio recording, both personal and professional, are not permitted.
- Disturbing or feeding animals is not permitted.
- Damaging or picking from gardens and grounds features is not permitted.
- Eating or drinking, except for clear bottled water, is only permitted in designated areas.
- Shoes and shirts must be worn at all times.
- Use of sporting equipment is not permitted.
- Using drones or remote devices is not permitted.

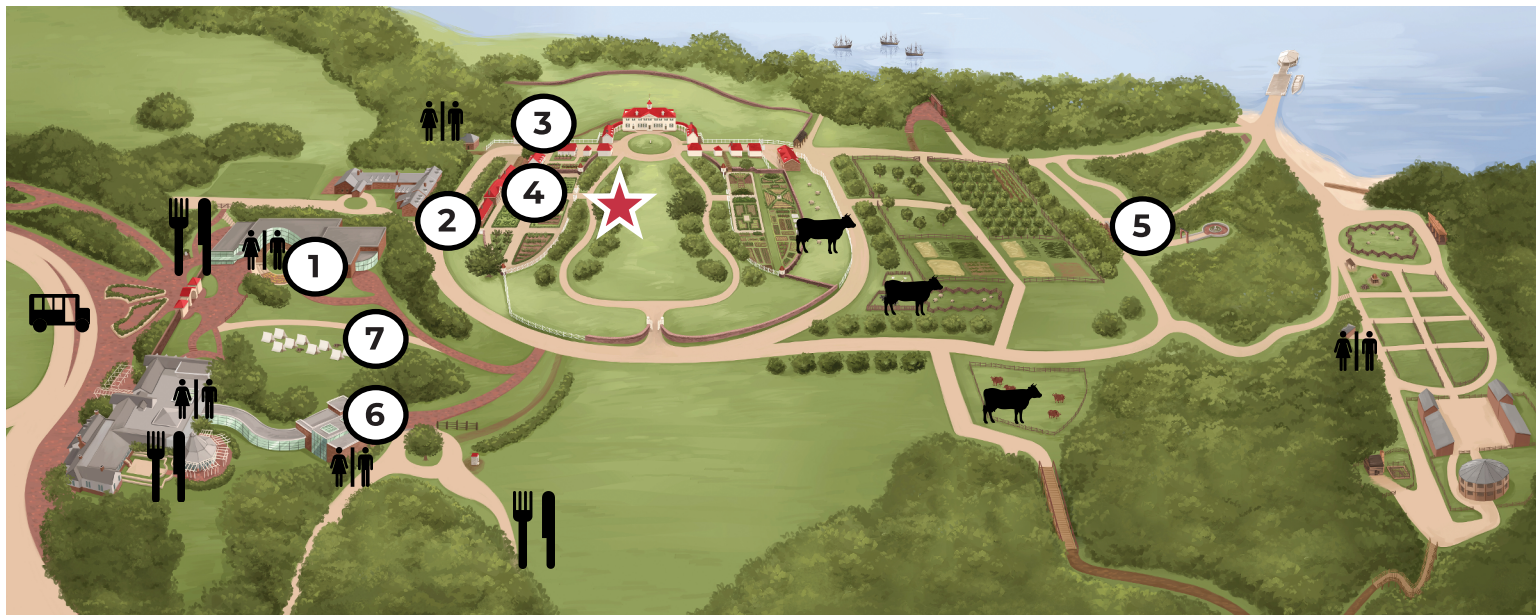
Baggage Policies:
